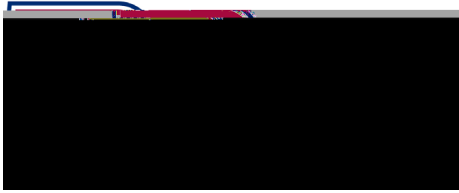




# Annual Assessment Report for Academic Programs



Residents are trained in all aspects of management of surgical and surgical management of periodontal diseases. Residents are required to pass 20 clinical competencies as outlined in the program (Figure 8) non surgical periodontal therapy two each of the following: including periodontal exam and treatment plan, scaling and root planning, periodontal reevaluation and periodontal maintenance; ten (10) periodontal and implant related surgical procedures including the following: osseous resective surgery, soft tissue surgery, dental implant placement and dental provisionalization.)

Outcomes for the procedures described above coincide with required resident performance skills outlined in the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) standards for the Advanced Dental Education Program in Periodontics. Performance rated for each applicable outcome area are listed in an End of Course Report form. The report is reviewed by the Division the semester following completed course during a scheduled schoolwide Curriculum Review session.

Residents are evaluated daily, semiannually and annually by the faculty and program director. The benchmark for daily performance/evaluations is based on a minimum level of "Acceptable" based on a scale of G, A, S. (G = Goal set d
